HEAD LINES FROM Mr Miller MacDonald

A team of inspectors from the local authority and Education Scotland visited Sgoil Lionacleit early in December as part of Validated Self-Evaluation (VSE). VSE aims to support and challenge the work of education authorities through HMIe and the Council working in partnership. Our VSE visit gave pupils the opportunity to talk about the school and to describe some of the projects that they have been involved with this term. The inspectors were pleased at the range of Skills for Work courses on offer and said there were some very good examples of leadership activities throughout the school community as well.

I will be consulting with parents in January on plans to alter the curriculum in Sgoil Lionacleit by introducing a 3 + 3 curriculum model. Years S1, S2 and S3 form the Broad General Education and S4, S5 and S6 form the Senior Phase. The new range of SQA National qualifications suits the 3 + 3 curriculum model.

May I wish all pupils, parents and staff a merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

Island Youth Project

A new filmmaking project gets underway at Sgoil Lionacleit. Facilitator of the two year project, Paul Steele, said: "One of the hopes for the project is that it will allow the participants to become more enterprising and develop production skills which will be transferable to other areas of their future careers whilst potentially developing careers related to media and media production."

On the 7th November our S3 Hospitality class teamed up with the Crofting Course to prepare school meals using locally sourced wild Greylag Goose. We decided to use popular recipes that we already use in the HE Department and adapt them using goose meat. We then asked a group of staff and pupils to come and taste the meals. We came up with four main meal ideas which were curry, burgers, lasagne and bolognaise.

After carrying out a meal evaluation survey we found that the most popular dish was the curry. The goose curry will appear on the menu at the school canteen in January. *Rhianna Gordon and Catriona MacLeod S3*

The drive to take Greylag off the Machair and onto the menu has been developed due of the increase in the number of geese on Machair land in recent years. This has become an increasing problem for the crofting community because of the damage done to grazing and crops.
